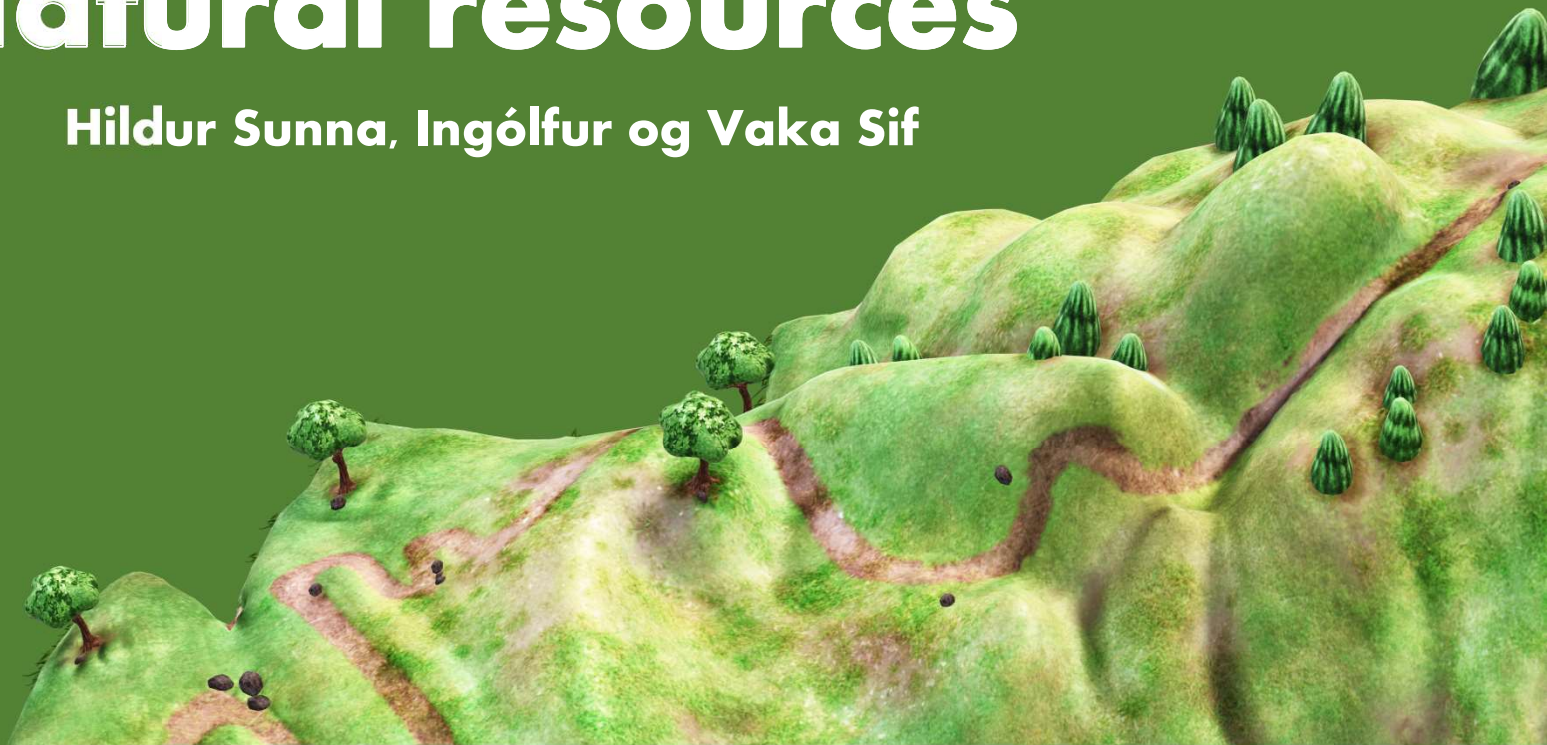


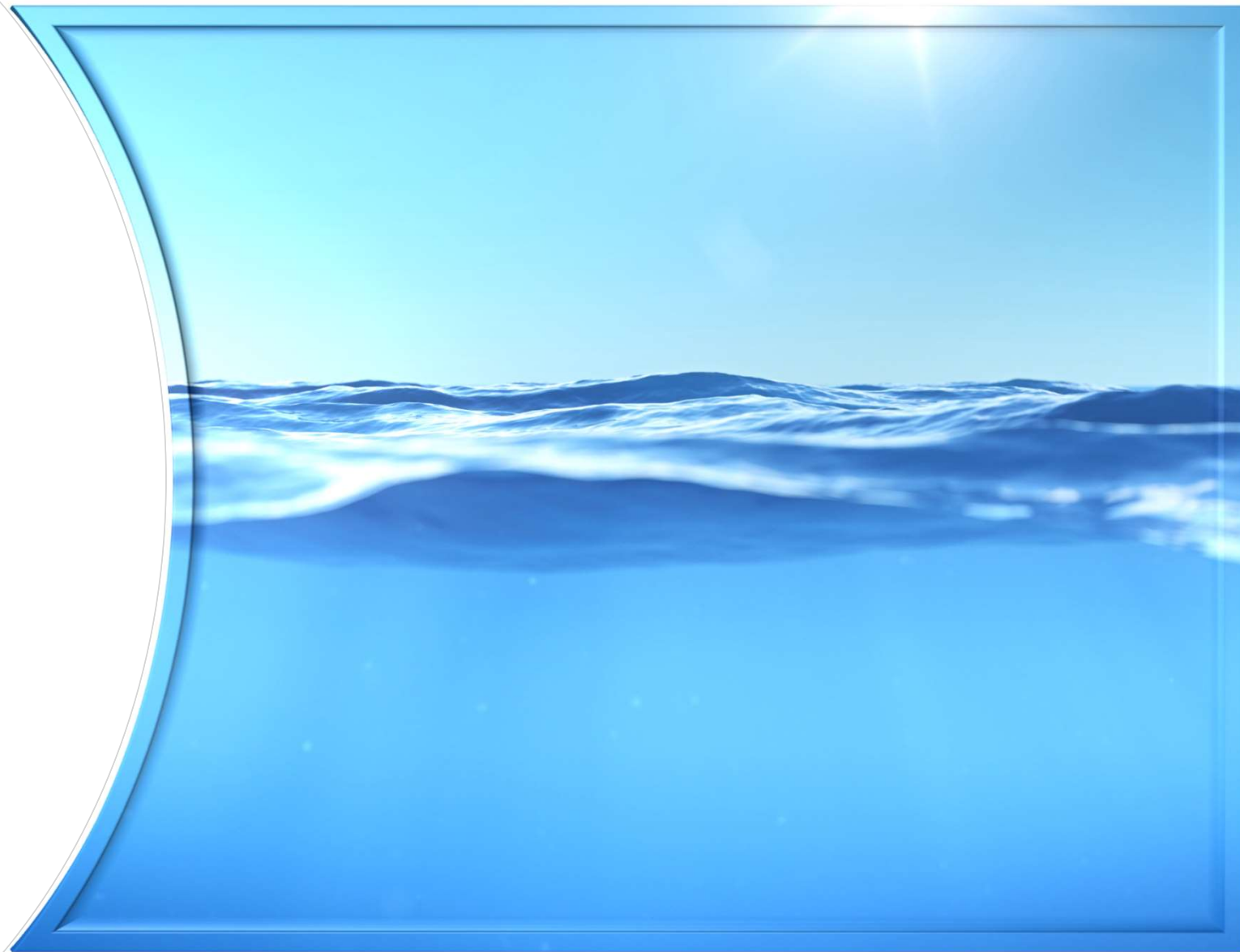

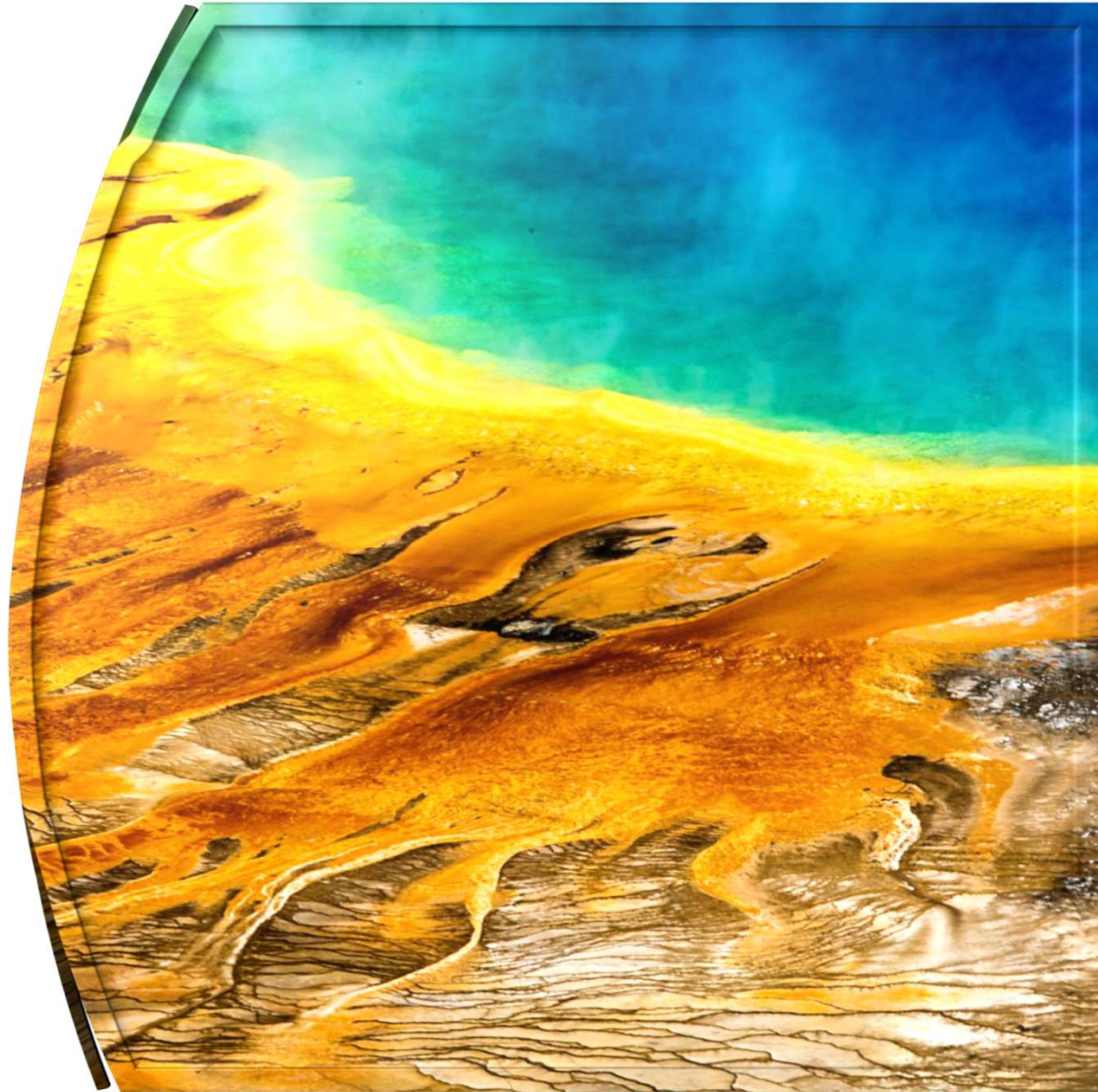
Water in Iceland

- It's very clean.
- It's our biggest resource.
- Free of most chemicals.
- Drinking water comes from the mountains.



Hot water

- Hot water powered by volcanic activity.
- Geothermal heating.
- Producing energy.



Geothermal spa

- The Blue Lagoon is the most famous spa in Iceland.
- Good for healing, especially with psoriasis and eczema.
- Accidentally created by runoff from a near geothermal power station.



Forests

- The biggest Icelandic forest is Hallormsstaður in East of Iceland.
- Planting of trees in Iceland starts about 120 years ago – is today a growing industry.



Fishing Industry

- A big part of culture.
- Trawlers.
- Quota system regarding fishing.
- Höfn used to be a lobster town because of the town's large share in the quota.



Agriculture in Iceland



- There are around 2400 farms in Iceland, but that number is declining fast.
- There are around 800.000 sheep during the summer in the country.
- The Icelandic horse has five gates:
 - Fet/walk.
 - Brokk/trot.
 - Tölt.
 - Stökk/Gallop.
 - Skeið/pace.
